

The Human Footprint Index

The Human Footprint Index (HFI) expresses as a percentage the relative human influence in each terrestrial biome. HFI values range from 0 to 100. A value of zero represents the least influenced - the "most wild" part of the biome with value of 100 representing the most influenced (least wild) part of the biome.

Legislative Reform in the Rangelands

Fact Sheet – November 2015

Background

The Rangelands represent 87 percent of the land mass of the State, making it an asset of immense economic, social, cultural and environmental value for all West Australians.

Pastoral leases cover approximately one third of the Rangelands while unallocated Crown land (UCL), unmanaged reserves (UMR), the conservation estate and other tenure make up the remainder.

For over a hundred years the predominant land use of just over a third of the Australian rangelands has been the grazing of sheep and cattle on pastoral vegetation found in the landscapes.


